Syllabus on 2022 National English Grammar Challenge for College Students (NEGCCS)

1. Purpose & Requirements

National English Grammar Challenge for College Students (NEGCCS) requires students to have a complete and systematic understanding of the English grammar system, and be able to use grammar knowledge to improve their language practice ability. According to this requirement, the challenge aims to examine the basic theory, basic knowledge and basic skills of English grammar, focusing on the comprehensive application ability of the basic rules of English grammar. Therefore, contestants are asked to:

- I. Have a comprehensive understanding of the system, system and concept of English grammar.
- II. Have a clear and accurate understanding of the forms, meanings and functions of the basic points of English grammar, grammar and syntax.
 - III. The basic rules of English grammar must be proficient in comprehensive use.

2. Format

3. Type & Weight

There are four parts to this exam. A total of 100 points:

- I. Multiple-choice questions, in the form of a sentence, a total of 20 questions, a total of 40 points, 2 points for each question.
- II. Binary-choice question, in the form of a sentence. A total of 10 questions, a total of 20 points, a single question 2 points.
- III. Fill in the blanks with appropriate words, in the form of sentences, a total of 10 questions, a total of 20 points, 2 points for each question.
 - IV. Cloze, in the form of text, a total of 10 questions, a total of 20 points, 2 points for each question.

4.Difficulty Distribution

About 20% of the easy questions, 50% of the medium difficulty questions, 25% of the more difficult questions, and 5% of the difficult questions.

5.Content Distribution

- I. Lexically (including nouns, articles, pronouns, prepositions, adjectives, adverbs, predicate verbs, non-predicate verbs) about 45%.
- II. Syntax (including sentence components, subject-verb agreement, tense voice, subjunctive mood, subordinate clauses, coordinating conjunctions, special sentence patterns) is about 55%.

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
